County of Peterborough Replacement of the North River Bridge - Please be advised that County Road 46 will be reduced to a single lane using temporary traffic signals at North River Bridge for replacement works commencing Monday June 15th 2020 for approximately 18 weeks. The North River Bridge is located on County Road 46 approximately 0.8 km west of the intersection with Anderson Road and approximately 12.1 km north of Havelock. Timelines are approximate and will vary dependent on weather and other factors. Every effort will be made to keep residents informed of significant changes. Work on weekends may be undertaken to accommodate completion.

On the Political Front –We monitor issues of concern to cottagers through HBM Lake Association and FOCA.

Your Septic/Holding Tank – Septic and holding tanks need a little love to work properly and keep our lake clean! Here are a few tips to keep in mind!

- 1. Keep track of when you last pumped out your septic or holding tank. If you don't know, have an operator come in, check the levels and that it is working properly.
- 2. Make sure that everyone using your cottage knows that you are on a septic/holding tank and that **ONLY** water, sewage and a limited amount of toilet paper should be put down the drains; and **NO** tampons, wipes, paper towels and kitchen grease, or bleach, cleaners and other chemicals that will kill the bacteria that live in the septic system. Post instructions in the bathroom and at kitchen sinks!
- 3. Take a walk on your septic bed and look for any pooling of water that might suggest the tile bed is not functioning.
- 4. **Never park or store** items on the septic bed. The tiles and tank can be crushed!
- 5. Remove all vegetation that will produce roots that can clog the tiles from the septic bed.
